

Philip Poloway fonds**Dates:** ca. 1938 - 1970**Physical Extent:** 12 cm of textual records; 3 b&w photographs**Biographical History:**

Philip Poloway was born in 1898 in Ukraine. He came to Canada in 1911 and worked for the Grand Trunk Railway in Ontario during the war. He then moved to Edmonton where he met his wife Ann Panchyshyn and they married in 1921. The couple purchased Riverlot 22A in St. Albert in 1927 and farmed here until about 1968. Philip and Ann had three children, Stella, Mary and John. Philip died in 1973 at the Sturgeon General Hospital.

Scope and Content:

Fonds consists of a letter in Ukrainian with photographs as well as newspapers, magazines, journals about farming and equipment, advertisements from St. Albert stores and farm equipment manuals. Also included is a Combine Operator's manual and receipts, bills and a ledger.
